

Lifestyle for Humans Learning from Nature

I would like to share something with you which touched me deeply just recently. There was a television special recently called the "Kingdom of Jaguars" that recorded the life of the jaguars in South America which is one of the few places in the world where jaguars still exist. In one of the scenes of this special feature, one rather young jaguar went stalking around in search of food. After failing to catch a wild boar, a tapir, and a turtle, it comes across a fawn which has wandered away from its parents. The jaguar was just about to attack this fawn when the father deer jumped in his way from the side and ran away slowly in a different direction to distract the jaguar. This buck willingly became the easy victim of the jaguar to save his offspring. The buck most likely wanted to save the fawn by giving the jaguar something else to eat. This was a quiet drama which took place without one scream heard.

Here we see the great wisdom of nature which mankind must imitate—the preservation of the species by laying one's life down to protect one's child. Adults sacrificing themselves in this manner are seen quite frequently in nature. And these animals make such sacrifices as the natural and expected thing, and they do not play up this sacrifice.
