Are you able to explain how the True Law is a science? Are you not drawing the simple conclusion that since the True Law is the truth, it agrees with everything that is true? This is no different than the explanations offered by other religious groups. Why do you think we state that the True Law is the truth? What we mean by this is that it applies to all situations and relates to all things.

What does it mean to be scientific? It refers to a methodology for pin pointing the root cause of things. The reason the True Law can be called a science is because it serves to explain the workings of people's minds and it looks for the cause of human behavior and seeks solutions. As stated in an earlier message, "salvation" means to no longer have any doubts. In most religions, salvation is understood to be ridding oneself of all problems and doubts by relying totally on God. Yet it is obvious just by looking at the various religious groups, how this is not "salvation."

The reason the True Law is related to everything and is able to provide solutions for all problems is because it is based on a scientific approach. In the practice of the True Law, a person always thinks about the reasons and causes of things. It is an individual problem for each of you to decide what to do in any given situation, and to make efforts to this end.

The True Law being a science means that it is a methodology for living. One must use the True Law to penetrate various issues and to find the best possible viewpoint and solution in any situation. The True Law by itself, however, cannot fulfill anyone's life. It is up to your own awareness whether the True Law is fully applied as the truth, or whether it becomes something like a

religion. The True Law is a teaching which depends entirely on you.
